

REBECCA KURTZ-GARCIA JACOB GARCIA





I wanted to take a moment to commemorate what a glorious year we have had in our Small Saints Room. This year, we have nearly doubled the number of children we serve and created a thriving environment for both learning and prayer (not to mention play and fun!). This is in no small part due to the extraordinary efforts of our own Janie Hilland. Janie stepped into the breach post-COVID when the digital manager position grew and required me to step away from organizing our children's ministry. Janie jumped at the chance to lead and expand our offerings to the smallest saints among us and did so with patience, grace, and joy that brought everyone a renewed sense of excitement.

The children now have regular opportunities to offer their singing during Mass; they have a schedule full of charismatic, loving Sunday School teachers; and they have weekly prayer circles where they deepen their relationship with each other and with God. Janie has two young children of her own, but if you walked into Small Saints room, you'd think they were all hers, as her gentleness and care are given to every young person that walks through that door. I know that I speak for the entire All Saints staff, volunteers, parishioners, parents, and, of course, the Small Saints, when I say THANK YOU to Janie! Thank you for a year of growth, excitement, and love in the Small Saints program. We are grateful to God for making All Saints and Small Saints your church home.

Laundry Love washes the clothes and bedding of low/no income families and person(s)

across the United States. We brighten the lives of people through love, dignity,

detergent by partnering with a local laundromat.

Laundry Love Riverside (LLR) started in January 2020 at the Sparklean laundromat at the corner of University Avenue and Chicago Boulevard. For over three years, LLR helped its clients by providing detergent and dryer sheets as well as paying for the machines so the clients could get their clothes and bedding clean. On the third Wednesday of every month, LLR showed up to the Sparklean laundromat and assisted hundreds of clients with thousands of loads of laundry.

In March 2023, the Sparklean laundromat sold and the new owner was not interested in continuing its partnership with Laundry Love Riverside. Starting in the summer of 2023, Sherri Bradley and I visited 15 laundromats in Riverside looking for a new home for LLR. Many laundromats do not have staff onsite nor do they have contact information for the owner.

For the few owners that we were able to make contact with, only one owner was interested in pursuing a partnership with LLR. From June 2023 – January 2024, LLR was in contact with the owner who was interested in helping the community but unable to assuage the fears of his staff. His staff felt unsafe with the prospect of a service to the community and how they've experienced many negative contacts with their unhoused neighbors. Ultimately in January 2024, communication with the owner ended.

In May 2024, another of the previous owners whom Sherri Bradley and I spoke to a number of times called me and stated he was interested in partnering with Laundry Love Riverside. He has staff onsite and with each visit to his laundromat, his staff was very enthusiastic about the prospect of this partnership. Ultimately, he is on board for supporting his community and partnering with LLR.

On July 17, 2024, Laundry Love Riverside will be back! We are hosting our first event of our re-boot at Rachel's Lavanderia on the corner of Iowa Avenue and Massachusetts Avenue from 6:00 - 8:00 p.m. We are in need of volunteers! St Michael's Foodshare Update

The long winter is finally behind us! Over the last few months we experienced a decrease in the fresh fruit and vegetables available to our friends at St. Michael's. The incessant rains ruined many crops and there were many weeks we supplied canned foods to augment our usual foodstuffs. However, God never failed to provide us with an overabundance of Brussel sprouts which our dedicated volunteers bagged weekly. In the last four weeks we served 165 families in spite of the limited foods available. God provided for all-no one was left out.

Everyday miracles seem to be all around us on Thursday mornings. A few weeks ago I went into the back room to get more bags and came across four of the regular St. Michaels workers conducting a spontaneous prayer circle with no clergy present. Their sincerity was evident in the loving manner in which they took turns speaking. There was an ongoing incident taking place on the church grounds where the police were removing one the female tenants from the apartments because of her erratic and belligerent behavior. Everyone was holding hands and praying for her to be safe and get the help she needed, recognizing her challenges and acknowledging the "goodness" that was lying deep within her. I was a bit overwhelmed at what was transpiring in that darkened room. God is everywhere, everyday.

We still need volunteers on Thursday mornings (also someone to help us pick up the bread) and donations of plastic and paper bags to recycle. Clothing donations are also appreciated. There is clearly marked bin in the entry to Smith Hall entry where you can place your donations. God Bless.
